Measuring Your Kitchen

1. The Room

A. Measure wall to wall and draw a rough outline of your kitchen notating all doors, doorways and windows.

B. Measure the ceiling height and write it in the center of your drawing.

2. The Window & Entryways

Measure the width and height of the windows and all entry ways.

3. The Walls

Beginning at the top left corner of your drawing, measure to the first window, door or wall. Continue clockwise around the room and until the entire room has been measured. Note: When measuring windows and doors, the trim is considered part of the door or window.

4. Obstructions

A. Notate the exact location of the sink, water pipes, gas lines, radiators, and any other obstructions in the room that cannot be moved.

B. Measure the distance from the obstruction to the walls on either side of it.

5. The Appliances

A. Measure the width, height, and depth of all appliances

B. Mark the location for all of your appliances on your drawing.

Once your kitchen measured, starting in the corner at the arrow, begin sketching your new cabinets in the white area.
